- **Fit 4 The Cause:** This brand new 501(c)(3) non-profit organization raises funds and awareness for health related causes. Cindy Rakowitz, Founder, President, and Chair, is a PR Guru and newly licensed fitness maven. "Fun-Raising" money and awareness for health needs are provided by staging exercise programs led by professional instructors. They also provide wellness education for groups, individuals and special populations. The concept was born out of the success of recent high energy group X charitable events. - **Life After Brain Injury:** A non-profit organization where survivors are encouraged to participate, belong, and grow. They are an Independent Living-based organization and provide free support services to the brain injury community in and around Ventura County. They provide education about brain injury and connections to needed social services and agencies. Also training for survivors in the use of tools, strategies and accommodations that can compensate for compromised abilities. All are invited to attend support meetings and social activities to experience the sense of community and belonging that they are known for. - **Kids & Families Together:** A not-for-profit support, education and counseling resource center to provide services for individuals and families in foster care, kinship care and adoption, for the preservation of families and the physical, emotional and mental health of children. They opened their doors on January 1, 2000 after various individuals in the foster, kinship and adoptive communities came together to discuss the gaps they saw in services throughout Ventura County. Kids & Families Together's mission is to strengthen relationships by providing safe, supportive help that keep family members emotionally connected to one another. Children who have experienced trauma, abuse, neglect, loss, grief and multiple placements often need extraordinary care, understanding and "attachment-focused" therapeutic interventions. Parents/caregivers need specialized education, support and strategies that will enhance their ability to raise safe, healthy and nurtured children.  


## What's New?

Community Conscience's 27<sup>th</sup> year of operating the building known as Under One Roof in Thousand Oaks has been extremely busy and very rewarding. A part of our mission is to promote maximum coordination among the agencies. Sharing information about the services each one provides ensures that their clients can take advantage of various services that are available.

We are proud to say that we recently updated our strategic plan, reviewed the usage of space and needs of the organizations located at Under One Roof and were able to have three new charities join our program.

LSS Community Care Center needed some more space two days a week for a volunteer to enter new clients into a computer tracking program. Conejo Youth Employment Services was happy to share their offices for this important task. Holy Family Services was able to share their office space with two new charities, Life After Brain Injury and Fit 4 The Cause, since each one only needed to see clients in Thousand Oaks a few days a week.

Hospice of the Conejo has been sharing their offices with Conejo Youth Employment for job interview training and Conejo Pregnancy Center for birthing classes. Villa Esperanza Services informed Community Conscience that if they had some more space they could close their Westlake Village office and combine all their services here. This would save their organization \$40,000 per year in rent, making a major impact on their ability to serve more clients. We were able to accommodate their request!

Aarron Kitman, Vice President of Adult Services at Villa Esperanza Services stated, *"At Villa Esperanza Services our goal is to allocate all of our available resources to enhance the lives of adults and children living with developmental disabilities. Our ongoing partnership with Community Conscience allows us to do just that by dramatically reducing our overhead and bringing together our staff Under One Roof! We can't thank them enough for their ongoing assistance and we hope that you will support them in their mission to assist community nonprofits in the Thousand Oaks area."*

This past year I have had the privilege and honor to work very closely with the charities, their staff, and volunteers. LSS Community Care Center hired Denise Cortes as their new Area Director, Conejo Pregnancy Center hired Teresa Menchaca as their Executive Director and Senior Concerns Thrift Store has been remodeled and has hired two new managers, Candy and Nes.

Funding for maintaining the building is met through donations made by individuals and businesses. 

## In Memory of Fred Wilson, Founder of Community Conscience

Fred Pierce Wilson, 87, founder of Community Conscience "Under One Roof" Human Services Center passed away on July 27, 2015 in Thousand Oaks California, where he had lived for 52 years. Fred was born in Philo, Illinois and grew up during the depression. He joined the Army and upon his return from service he attended and graduated from the University of Illinois. Next he began a career in public accounting. In 1953, he married Carol Blades. They moved to California and had three children, David, Elizabeth and Diane. Sadly, Carol passed away in 1983.

In 1963 Fred became Controller and then Chief Financial Officer for the Janss Development Corporation. At that time they were the drivers of the growth of the Conejo Valley. Later he opened his own accounting firm which supported much of the commercial development and wealth of his community. One of Fred's greatest legacies is the way he helped to develop the human and social capital of the Conejo. He served on many boards, including Los Robles Hospital and Gregor Mendel Botanic Foundation, and was president of the Conejo Future Foundation. He helped to found the Westlake Village Rotary club and was instrumental in linking with its sister club in Moscow.

In the 1980's, Fred was feeling frustrated by the reduced funding for community-based social service projects. He discovered that although there were many agencies in the community helping people in need those agencies were spread out all over the Conejo Valley. That meant those individuals would have to travel from place to place for services. Many of these individuals did not have any transportation.

In 1981 Fred, along with his son David and other concerned citizens, decided to help these organizations by reducing rent and consolidating services. Fred realized that what was needed was a place where these agencies could be centralized. So the seed was planted by these community leaders and this seed would grow into the 20,000 sq. ft. "Under One Roof" building. Today there are 13 non-profit organizations all receiving rent-free office space in the human services center building at 80 E. Hillcrest Drive in Thousand Oaks.

Fred's amazing contributions to the health of the city have been recognized by many. The City Council named a Chamber seat in his honor and in 1984 he was named Chamber of Commerce's Man of the Year. That same year Marjorie Musick was honored as Woman of the Year. The two civic leaders were married in 1987 and together became leading citizens of the Conejo. They led very full social and philanthropic lives that definitely followed Fred's advice: "Live it Up!"
