2015 Mardi Gras Ball honors Ed & Lynn Hogan as King & Queen

Our 2015 Mardi Gras Ball Queen & King, Lynn and Ed Hogan, are being honored for the significant difference they have made in the local community. Over the years, Lynn and Ed have been publicly recognized for their many accomplishments by more than 30 governmental, civic, philanthropic, and educational organizations.

Lynn, a graduate of the prestigious Pratt Art Institute, and Ed, an entrepreneur and a man passionate about travel, were high school sweethearts and married in 1951. In 1959, Ed and Lynn Hogan founded Pleasant Holidays, which would become the largest tour operator serving Hawaii.

In 1998, they created the Hogan Family Foundation to pursue their philanthropic interests.

The Hogan Family Foundation is a non-profit organization dedicated to promoting the entrepreneurial spirit through the creation and operation of educational, civic-minded, and humanitarian programs designed to encourage a more productive and contributory society. The Hogan Family Foundation has operated numerous programs requiring volunteer support that have positively affected hundreds of thousands of area residents and visitors.

Some of the Foundation's humanitarian efforts include:

Hogan Angel Flight Program provides air transportation for people in need of medical treatment and diagnosis who are unable to afford the high cost of travel.

Rancho St. Francis - Equestrian Education maintains two ranches that house and rehabilitate abused and abandoned horses and large breed dogs, and, through them, help special needs, disabled and needy children and adults, children of deployed military, and others.

Lifeline 4 Paws Dog Rescue Support provides a program that focuses on helping homeless pets by supporting rescue groups with medical sponsorships for desperately needed and often lifesaving medical care.

Gardens of the World exist not only as a cultural contribution to the community, but as an educational tool. This 4.5 acre garden in Thousand Oaks is open to the public and is a striking monument to commemorate the various cultures of the world.

The Foundation's contribution to education focuses on encouraging the entrepreneurial spirit through the Hogan Entrepreneurial Programs at Gonzaga University in Spokane, Washington and Chaminade University in Honolulu, Hawaii. The programs prepare students to create new ventures that make a positive difference in society and are designed for promising individuals who demonstrate academic excellence, leadership, creativity and a commitment to serve others.

Under the chairmanship of Ed and Lynn Hogan, the Hogan Family Foundation continues to develop new programs. Their desire to "give back" to their community is a gesture of gratitude for the success they have enjoyed in their lives. Since its inception, the Foundation has invested more than \$80 million in its educational and charitable programs.

Ed and Lynn make their home in Lake Sherwood. They have four children: Brian, Christine, Gary and Glenn; each of whom holds executive positions with the Foundation and the Hogan's travel companies. They have four grandchildren and three great grandchildren. The Hogans continue their active lifestyles with business and charitable endeavors and through their world travels.

It is important to us that organizations in our Under One Roof building do not have duplicate services. Please visit our website www.communityconscience.org for details about the other organizations


currently Under One Roof. We are excited about hearing from organizations who would like to be a part of the community of agencies that work together here.



More than 20 years ago, while working as a volunteer with foster children, Lynda Miller started to work on a dream. By 2000 – after she gained the trust of the kids and their families, organized volunteers, grew the support group, raised funds – Support for the Kids became an official nonprofit. Today, her organization provides tutoring and educational enrichment to more than 1,000 kids in the foster care system in Ventura County. Support for the Kids has no paid employees and no overhead and all funds raised go directly to the kids. Lynda also created “Speakers for Succe\$\$,” a program that provides professionals from all backgrounds the opportunity to talk to foster kids about staying in school and working hard. Lynda received the Interface Children & Family Services’ Volunteer of the Year award, the Rotary’s Living Treasure award, Rio School District’s Hero Award, the YMCA’s Leadership award, and many more. If her life weren’t full enough, she serves as a Community Conscience trustee and an advisory board member for Rio School District.


Dr. Dawson currently serves on the Community Conscience Advisory Council. In 1995 he was honored for his community involvement as King of the Mardi Gras Ball.

When the Conejo Free Clinic first opened in 1976, it required a doctor to use his private medical license and take on the volunteer role of medical director. Dr. Dawson volunteered to take on the major responsibility nearly 40 years ago-and has held that role every since. Dr. Dawson finds time to see patients at the Free Clinic while maintaining his family practice in Thousand Oaks as well as being on the staff at Los Robles Hospital. He also serves as the chairman of the Conejo Free Clinic’s fundraiser, the annual Fall Golf Classic, now in its 27th year. Undere his direction, and in large part due to his tireless support, the Conejo Free Clinic helps thousands of grateful people with free medical services every year, including the uninsured, the under-insured, and people who haven’t seen a doctor in years. Dr. Dawson says his greatest accomplishment is making medical decisions that have dramatically improved the quality of life or saved the life of his patients. Dr. Dawson is also on the Calvary Community Church medical emergency team.

Conejo Youth Employment Services Welcomes New President, John Havey

Conejo Youth Employment Services (CYES) has been helping youth in the Conejo Valley for decades. John Havey has been volunteering his time working with young adults at the organization for several years. In the fall of 2014 John joined the board of trustees as President.

CYES has been working with teens in an exciting new program that started in 2014 - the Community Internships Training Youth (CITY). This program includes partnerships with Greater Conejo Chamber of Commerce, CLU, Conejo Unified School District and Conejo Recreation and Park District. Local businesses and non-profits have internship positions for the youth lasting 6 weeks in the summer.

This valuable program teaches them job skills and gives them a chance to "try on" the jobs to see if they would like to work towards a career in those fields. CYES' role in this partnership is to work with the youth in preparing resumes and job interview skills. Since 2014 this program has more than doubled in size.

CYES has also begun helping disadvantaged youth with food and clothing. There is a growing need for volunteers at the organization both to work with the teens and board of trustees. **If you are interested in volunteering with CYES, please contact them at 805 496-6868.**

Youth employment referral service is for ages 14 - 22. CYES offers free job search assistance and referrals, including employment counseling and pre-employment skills training workshops. Youth can be hired to assist with computers, office work, moving, housework, and yard work.

CYES is located in Suite 207 at the Community Conscience "Under One Roof" Human Services Center building.
